

Many of us were not ready for the fires of Oct. 8. Here are some tips to remember if you are ever caught in a situation like that night.

- Take your medicines.
- Have a box ready with important documents, passports, deeds, insurance info, checks, etc.
- Flashlights and batteries. Cell phones and chargers.
- Toss clothes from the laundry basket and dryer into a bag.
- Take water
- Alert neighbors. Blow your car horn.
- Put out your hoses. Also, if there's time, leave buckets filled with water around the outer edges of property.
- Leave note on front door that you left. Leave door and windows closed but unlocked.

For a safe drive out of the evacuation area:

- Wear 100% cotton long sleeves and long pants.
- Pack a 100% cotton or wool blanket.
- Take your fire extinguishers with you.
